Type of governing document The Partnership is set up as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) governed by constitution. At the Annual General Meeting office bearers and trustees are appointed to run the day to day business of the Partnership. Any member of the Partnership is eligible to become a charity trustee or office-bearer. Nominations are sought in advance of the Annual General Meeting at which elections are held are results announced.
